

Cumberland Education Foundation (CEF) Grant Guidelines

1. Applicant Eligibility

Cumberland School Department administrators, faculty, support personnel, and club/activity supervisor to an academic oriented program may apply for funding to support enrichment projects that benefit Cumberland Public School students. Collaboration across classrooms, grades, disciplines and schools is strongly encouraged.

2. Project Eligibility

CEF will award grants for proposals that focus on traditional academic subjects, visual and performing arts, STEAM, and those that promote community/cultural learning experiences. In addition, CEF will look at grant proposals that:

- employ innovative methods or techniques to inform and educate
- show the most promise of significantly enhancing the educational process
- have a direct and immediate impact on the largest number of students
- yield materials or processes that will benefit future students

CEF grants are not intended to replace or relieve the existing responsibility for public funding of schools nor are they intended to be a substitute for normal budget growth and maintenance. These may include: compensation shortfalls, capital improvements, professional development opportunities that are outside the district or not tied to the curriculum, equipment purchases that are not part of a specific project, and the ongoing maintenance of existing curriculum programs.

3. Application Process

Applicants should develop their proposal idea. Next, they should review proposals with administration to ensure they are in line with the district's goals and specific school objectives. Applicants are encouraged to discuss proposals with colleagues and solicit their feedback and support for participation in the grant proposal. Applicants must complete the grant application and have their building administrator endorse the application. Applications can be submitted via google form.

4. Application Evaluation

The CEF Board will review grant applications based on the criteria outlined. The Grant Evaluation Rubric is provided. All applications should comply with the following:

The application must be complete and comply with deadlines. It should be a clearly typed presentation and include the appropriate forms. The applications should be clearly written and understood by non-educators. It must include all authorizing signatures. The proposal should demonstrate creativity and innovation in educational programming. Proposals may seed an initiative that can be replicated in other schools or grades, promising to benefit students in future years. If programs include a request for equipment funding, the application should detail an educational program in which the equipment would be used. All technological hardware requests need to be pre-approved by the Cumberland School Department Director of Information Technology. The proposals should not seek retroactive funding for an existing program.
